

## **RESOLUTION FOR NEGOTIATED SALE**

**WHEREAS**, G.S. 160A-266(b) authorizes counties to dispose of surplus property by methods outlined therein; and

**WHEREAS**, the County desires to declare one Glock .45, serial number PCK837, and one Glock .45, serial number PCK830, Models 21 and clips as surplus weapons. These weapons are over 10 years old, and have been carried as duty weapons by Officers Joe Francis and Jeremy Munday. Whereas, the condition and age of these weapons will necessitate that the weapons simply be stored, as they are not of condition to be carried as duty weapons. It is current policy of the Sheriff's Office to issue GEN4 model Glockes. Therefore, the older weapons are of no use to the Ashe County Sheriff's Office, and due to the condition and age of the weapons, they are not fit to be re-issued to future officers.

**WHEREAS**, the Ashe County Sheriff's Office has agreed to allow Joe Francis and Jeremy Munday to purchase the weapons they carried during their tenure with the Sheriff's Office as patrol deputies for fair market value; that being \$300.

**WHEREAS**, G.S. 160A-279 states that the County may convey to any public or private entity, which is authorized to receive appropriations from a city or county, surplus property with or without compensation, by adopting a resolution or order authorizing an appropriate county official to dispose of the property under the conditions of a negotiated sale.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Ashe County Board of Commissioners, Jefferson, North Carolina, that the county manager or his designee is authorized to sell the above captioned weapons to Joe Francis and Jeremy Munday, past law enforcement officers of the Ashe County Sheriff's Office.
