Enterprise Fund:

To increase the Enterprise Fund budgeted expenditures from \$3,539,067 to \$3,571,617; this increase will be offset with revenues of \$32,550 from grant revenues for the single-stream recycling project.

Ashe County Middle School Site Coordinator Fawn Roark presented information on the program at the Middle School which began in Ashe County in 2017. The purpose of the program is to bring community involvement into the schools. Ms. Roark highlighted several projects at the Ashe County Middle School including a food pantry for students and a mentoring program that resulted from this program being in place.

Patricia Calloway, executive director of Ashe Services for Aging, shared challenges faced and successes achieved during the past year at Ashe Services for Aging. Some of the challenges they are facing include a waiting list for In-Home Aide services, retention of employees, workforce recruitment, and marketing of services. Success stories include establishment of a reserve fund for building maintenance, purchase of a new roof for the building, repaving of the parking lot, and the receipt of two grants. Finance Officer Mary Owen explained the budget revision which is necessary due to the inability to hire CNA's. Funds were moved to congregate meals, adult day care and day health, and senior center operations. Commissioner Rhodes made a motion to approve the FY2018-2019 H&CCBG Budget Revision as presented.
