BUSINESS SESSION

I. 9:00 AM - Meeting Called to Order at the Ashe County Courthouse

Chairman Sands called the Regular Meeting of the Ashe County Board of Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. at the Ashe County Courthouse.

Present: 5 - Commissioner Jeff Rose, Commissioner Larry Rhodes, Commissioner William Sands, Commissioner Paula Perry and Commissioner Todd McNeill

II. Selection of Chairman & Vice Chairman

County Manager Sam Yearick took over the meeting and asked for nominations for chairman. He told the Board that a second is not required on nominations. Commissioner Rhodes nominated Commissioner Sands for the position of chairman. Commissioner Rose nominated Commissioner Perry. With no further nominations being made. Commissioner Rhodes made a motion to close nominations. Commissioner Rose seconded the motion. The motion passed with unanimous approval. County Manager Yearick called for a vote on the nomination for Commissioner Sands to fill the position of chairman. Commissioners McNeill, Sands and Rhodes voted in favor. The county manager called for a vote on the nomination for Commissioner Perry to fill the position of chairman. Commissioners Rose and Perry voted in favor. County Manager Yearick then turned the meeting over to Chairman Sands. Chairman Sands opened the floor for nominations for the position of vice chairman. Chairman Sands nominated Commissioner Rhodes for the position of vice chairman. Commissioner Rose nominated Commissioner Perry for the position. With no further nominations being made, Commissioner Rhodes made a motion to close nominations. Commissioner McNeill seconded the motion. The motion passed with unanimous approval. Chairman Sands then called for a vote on the nomination of Commissioner Rhodes for the position of vice chairman. Commissioners McNeill, Sands and Rhodes voted in favor. Chairman Sands called for a vote on the nomination of Commissioner Perry for the position of vice chairman. Commissioners Perry and Rose voted in favor.

Vice Chairman Rhodes led the Pledge of Allegiance and Commissioner Perry offered the opening prayer.

Megan Wagoner, who is Community Services Block Grant Program director with Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission (BROC), requested approval of the FY2018 Community Services Block Grant. She told the Board that BROC services help to eliminate poverty in the region. Ms. Wagoner explained that a community needs assessment was held in December to determine needs in the area. The assessment found the need for transportation and for crisis intervention. She reviewed areas of the program and told the Board that a total of \$194,031 has been allotted for this year which will be divided among the different programs. In 2017 there were 1380 people assisted with the funds provided. Ms. Wagoner discussed the budget cut and explained that the state uses statistical information which leaves out a lot of people. The BROC Board of Directors has reviewed and approved the application. With no further comment, Vice Chairman Rhodes made a motion to approve the FY2018 Community Services Block Grant for BROC. Commissioner Perry seconded the motion. The motion passed with unanimous approval. Approved

Upper Mountain Research Station Research Operations Manager Tracy Taylor provided a PowerPoint presentation with a request for funding of \$12,000 for a fraser fir project. He explained that there has been a shift for Christmas tree growers to purchase out-of-state transplants which has now increased to 80% of transplants used. In 2012, sales of Christmas trees in Ashe County were \$30.5 million making Ashe County the number one tree producer in the state. Mr. Taylor spoke of the increased problem of root rot in trees. He requested the Board to partner with funding of \$12,000 for a project to build an 1800 square foot greenhouse for fraser fir research. He explained that grant funding for infrastructure is mostly non-existent. The project will provide information for local tree producers. The growers can see what works. Hopefully this will start a move toward transplant production in our state and will keep Ashe County dollars in Ashe County. Vice Chairman Rhodes recommended that the funding be placed in the budget for Mr. Taylor to handle. County Manager Yearick answered that a line item can be set up in the Cooperative Extension budget for the funds. Vice Chairman Rhodes made a motion to appropriate \$12,000 from the Economic Development budget, to set up a line item in the Cooperative Extension budget for the funds, and for staff to advertise for a public hearing to be held at the next meeting. Commissioner Rose seconded the motion. The motion passed with unanimous approval.
